The Titonka City Council met in regular session Thursday, March 12, 2020 at 7:00 P.M. at City Hall.

Mayor Boyken called the meeting to order, with council members Gail Hamilton, Allie Janssen, David LaGue, and Barbara Zwiefel present, Mike Fredrickson absent. City employees Paul Jahnke, Adam Posey and Karen Hamilton were also in attendance, along with 3 guests.

Motion was made by LaGue and seconded by Janssen to approve the agenda. 4 ayes, 0 nays, 1 absent (Fredrickson). Motion carried.

Motion was made by Zwiefel and seconded by Hamilton to approve the consent agenda. 4 ayes, 0 nays, 1 absent. Motion carried.

Mayor Boyken opened the public hearing at 7:02 P.M.

Motion was made by LaGue and seconded by Zwiefel to approve paying one fourth of the cost of the Titonka website redesign, at a cost not to exceed \$780. 4 ayes, 0 nays, 1 absent. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Zwiefel and seconded by Janssen to approve the purchase of a new 42-inchwide exterior entrance door for the Fitness Center, to replace the old wooden door. 4 ayes, 0 nays, 1 absent. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Zwiefel and seconded by LaGue to approve contracting for 240,000 gallons of propane for 2020-2021 heating season, at a price of approximately \$.67 a gallon. 4 ayes, 0 nays, 1 absent. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Hamilton and seconded by Zwiefel to approve Smidty's liquor license renewal, contingent on the renewal of his dram shop insurance. 4 ayes, 0 nays, 1 absent. Motion carried.

Motion was made by LaGue and seconded by Janssen to approve the Titonka Fire Department Foundation's liquor license application, contingent on dram shop insurance being in place. 4 ayes, 0 nays, 1 absent, motion carried.

Spring clean-up was discussed. It will be held on Saturday, May 2nd in the same manner as last year, with residents being required to bring their items to the City, behind the Buffalo Creek Activity Center, between the hours of noon and 4 P.M.

Motion was made by Zwiefel and seconded by Hamilton to approve the appointments of Brad Bengtson and Lee Carlton to the Board of Adjustment. 4 ayes, 0 nays, 1 absent. Motion carried.

Motion was made by LaGue and seconded by Janssen to approve the purchase of 4 new tires for the recycling trailer at a cost not to exceed \$768.00. 4 ayes, 0 nays, 1 absent. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Janssen and seconded by LaGue to approve the purchase of a new pump for the swimming pool slide, and other parts and fittings, at a total cost not to exceed \$4,000. 4 ayes, 0 nays, 1 absent. Motion carried.

Motion was made by LaGue and seconded by Zwiefel to approve the City obtaining a two-year charitable gambling license at a cost of \$150.00. 4 ayes, 0 nays, 1 absent. Motion carried.
