Motion was made by Etherington and seconded by Zwiefel to approve Bertha Helmers cleaning the Fitness Center for an additional \$50/month. 4 ayes, 0 nays, 1 absent. Motion carried.

The council discussed the school property.

Motion was made by Zwiefel and seconded by Hamilton to approve amending the TIF Agreement to rebate Titonka Savings Bank (TSB) a percentage of the new increment attributed to TSB's new facility. The Council will determine percentage of the rebate at a future meeting. The rebate will only be granted to TSB if the City of Titonka proceeds with the purchase of the school property. If the City proceeds with the purchase of the school property, TSB will donate the rebated increment back to the City. The donation would be designated to assist the City with annual operating and maintenance costs associated with the school property, with any surpluses to be designated for a capital repair fund. 4 ayes, 0 nays, 1 absent.
